

ACDF Debut in United Kingdom

After fourteen years of hard work in Nigeria as a reputable Civil Society Organisation and Social Entrepreneur, the African Citizens Development Foundation was recommended for Special Consultative Status with the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations January 19, 2009 at the United Nations headquarters in New York and the consultative status was officially confirmed on the 27th July at the United Nations headquarters in Geneva. The Foundation has the greatest challenge to succeed by ensuring that her Educational and Agricultural projects further developed and replicated in other parts of the African continent.

Apart from this, the Foundation considered it obligatory to do more towards scaling up the development of the African Citizens by involving the African Diasporas living around the globe and to inspire them to invest their knowledge which was originally drained from the continent. Hence, programmes that will re-integrate their knowledge and other resources back home are being organised by the ACDF in the UK. As it is too late to dream of re-inventing the wheel, together with the African Diasporas we can pick development from the Penthouse of their host countries which they have been part of the developments and which their home countries are seriously in need of to build a better society.

The Foundation also considered the need for it to site its first international office in the United Kingdom to be able to reach and partner with these African Diasporas and, to get fully involved in the work of the United Nations within the two headquarters in Europe; Geneva in Switzerland and Vienna in Austria.

Chief amongst the aim of sighting ACDF International headquarters in the United Kingdom is to be able to seek for voluntary-aided assistance for her various projects both in the UK and back home in Africa. ACDF was duly incorporated in the UK in May 2009 and located its office in Edinburgh, Scotland.
